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## Llama Show Information

**Health Requirements** - All animals from within Indiana do not need to have a health certificate. Animals coming from out of state must have a completed official health certificate within 30 days of exhibition.

**Eligibility** - All llamas must have ILR certificates with the exception of animals for youth or non-breeder classes. Registration papers must accompany entry form.

All exhibitors in the ALSA shows must be a member of ALSA or pay an Adult Non-Member fee of \$30.00. The ALSA Youth Non-Member fee is \$15.00. ALSA membership is not required for the Open Youth Show.

Youth participants may only show in one show for performance classes and showmanship – either the ALSA show or the Open Youth Show ..... not both. Youth may participate in halter classes.

Llamas may be shared between youth participants in different age divisions. Animals may be shared between the ALSA Show and the Open Youth Show.

**Arrival** - Arrival time for all exhibitors starts at 12:00 p.m. on Friday. Stalls will be pre-assigned.

**Stalling** - Stalls will be pre-assigned. Exhibitors will provide their own bedding. No paper products are permitted to be used for bedding. Minimum two animals per stall.

**Departure** - Please clean stalls upon departure at the end of the show. A \$10.00 fee will be charged for each stall left un-cleaned. You may have the 4-H Club clean your stalls for \$10.00 each.

**Manure** - Please deposit all straw, hay, and manure in the appropriate area. DO NOT deposit manure in trash cans!

**Wool Divisions** - Each animal must be entered in its appropriate age and wool division.

Suri - Suri body style and suri wool as described in the handbook.

Light - Minimal body wool, short neck wool with smooth legs.

Medium- Moderate to long body wool, minimal to moderate neck wool, smooth to moderate leg wool.

Heavy - Abundant body and neck wool with minimal to abundant leg wool.

### **Llama Age Divisions -**

Juvenile: 5 to 12 months of age

Yearling: 12 to 24 months of age

Two Year Old: 24 to 36 months of age

Adult: 36 months of age and over

### **Performance Classes -**

Animals may only show in ONE Performance Division (animals showing in Youth Division may NOT show in Open, Novice, Advanced, or Masters Division)

**Novice Performance Classes** - Once an animal has won 4 ALSA Performance Grand Champions or 3 ALSA Performance Grand Champions and 2 ALSA Reserve Grand Champions in Novice or Open Divisions, the animal will achieve the ALSA award of ALSA Novice Performance Grand Champion. That animal must now move into the Advanced Division.

**Advanced Performance Classes** - Open to all animals who have achieved the title of Novice Performance Champion or those who chose to skip Novice and go straight to the Advanced Performance Division. Once an animal has won 4 ALSA Performance Champions or 3 ALSA Performance Championships and 2 ALSA Reserve Performance Championships in Advanced or Open Performance Classes, the animal has the choice of moving to the Masters Performance Division or continuing in the Advanced Performance Division only until a maximum of 6 ALSA Performance Grand Championships has been achieved. After 6 Performance Champions have been achieved, the animal must move on to the Masters Division.

**Masters Performance Classes** – These classes are for the advanced performance animals that have completed the requirements for an ALSA Advanced Performance Champion as described above. Animals in this class can now earn the title of ALSA Masters Performance Champion.

**Pack Classes** - All llamas must be 5 mo. old or older. Llamas 5 to 36 months old must carry packs filled out with lightweight material. Llamas 36 months or older must carry a total of 20 pounds in the pack. Llamas in Youth Pack classes must carry a pack filled out with lightweight materials. No weight is necessary.

**Group Halter Classes** - In Produce of Dam class, you must enter the Dam, not the offspring. Two offspring from that dam are shown and must appear in previous halter classes in the show. In Get of Sire class, you must enter the Sire, not the offspring. Three offspring from that sire are shown and must appear in previous halter classes in the show.

### **Youth Ages:**

Youth Juniors - Handler age 8 through 11 (age as of January 1st of current year).

Youth Intermediates - Handler age 12 through 14 (age as of January 1st of current year).

Youth Seniors - Handler age 15 through 18 (age as of January 1st of current year).

**Dress** - Neat, appropriate attire is required. Open toed shoes, sandals, and bare feet will disqualify the exhibitor. No shorts, tennis shoes, or bare midriffs for Showmanship classes.

**Exhibitor's Meeting** - Saturday morning.

**Awards** - will be awarded to winners.

Novice, Advanced, & Masters Performance Champions and Youth Performance Champions awarded.

**Judges:** Gold Show – Allen Davis    Silver Show – Doug Overman    Open Youth Show - To be announced.

**Entry Deadline** – Entry postmarked by July 20.
